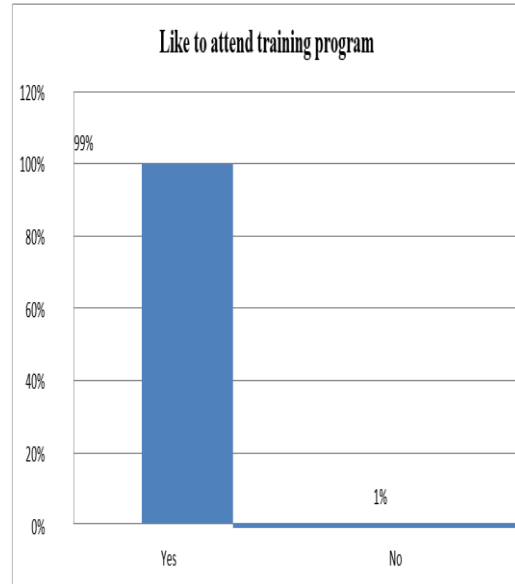
To round things out, in order to make an employee more flexible: An employee's skill set could be very broad or narrow, depending on the nature of the job. He lacks the necessary skills at the moment.

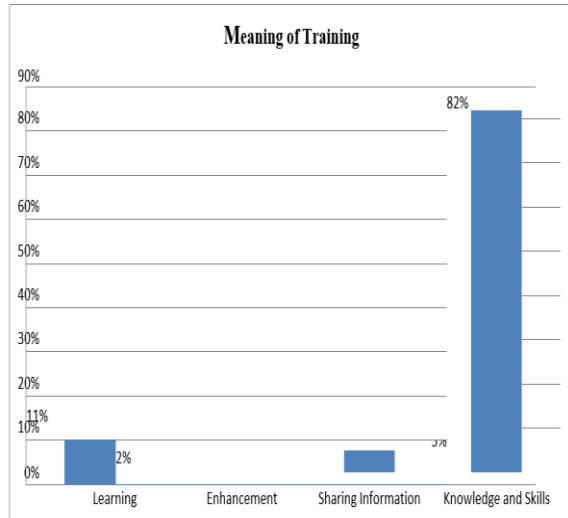
Interpretation:

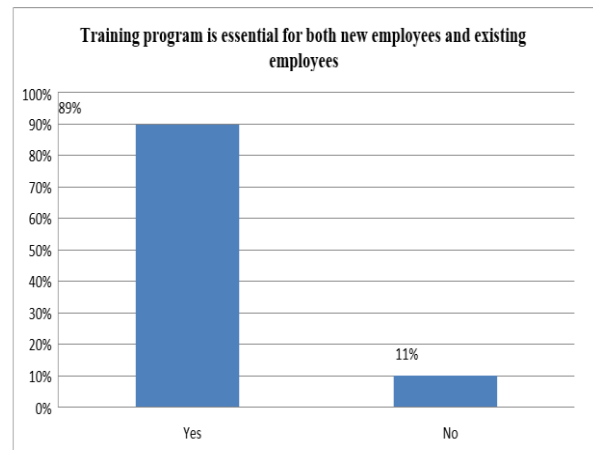
Interpretation:

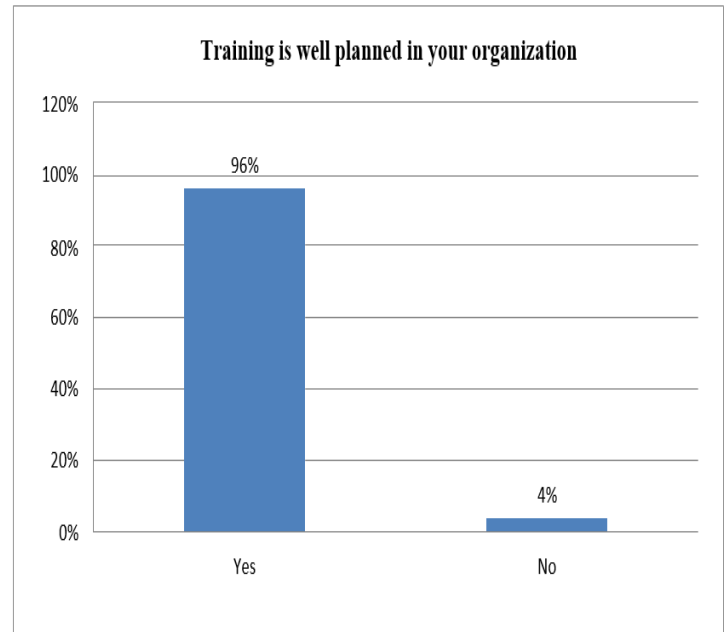
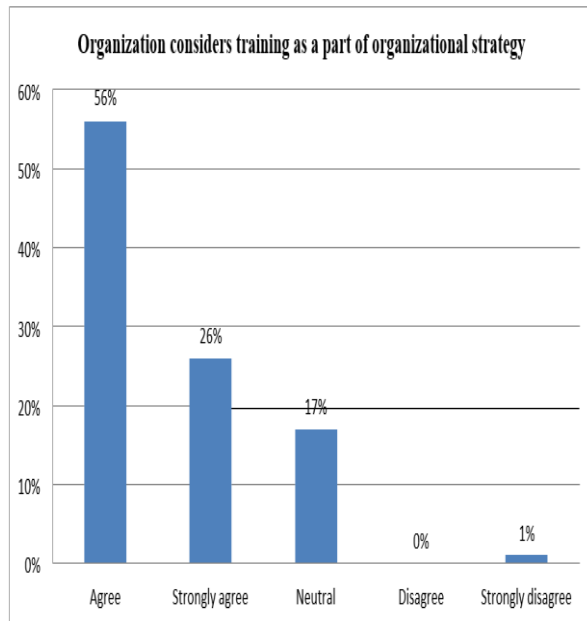
Interpretation:
